We are excited to announce Hull's first music industry conference 53° North organised by by The **Warren Youth Project** and **Warren Records** delivered in partnership with **Hull City Of Culture 2017**. 53° North is a new music industry conference that will take place on August 3rd and 4th 2017 at **Hull Truck Theatre** and **The Albemarle Music Centre** leading into Hull's grassroots unsigned music festival **Humber Street Sesh** on Saturday 5th. The **Humber Street Sesh** attracts around 30,000 people and has become one of the countries most vibrant and diverse underground music festivals platforming exiting new music from Hull and the UK (see <u>here</u>).

We will bring together panels of local and national industry to open up discussion around what it means to be part of the music industry in 2017 and offer an opportunity to watch some of the most exciting artists around at the moment. Hull has a rich history of underground DIY music, which has built a thriving community in our city, and now it's time to create links with the rest of the world to empower our artists and music workers to look at how they can build and sustain careers on their own terms. We will be talking about self-promotion, releasing, royalty extraction, artist branding, recording, equality, mental health and much more as well as looking at careers behind the artist. Hull has been developing a thriving underground music scene and we're inviting you to take a look inside.

The event will consist of engaging panels, speed-dating, one-to-one advice, networking, live performances and more. It will be an opportunity for music industry professionals to meet Hull creatives, network within the industry and see one of the countries biggest grassroots music showcase festivals.

#### Matt Wanstall (Musicians Union) – Mind Your Own Business

One MU official present on 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> August in order to:

- Participate in industry panels, moderating if necessary.
- Deliver one to one, drop in, or roundtable advice sessions if applicable.
- Deliver workshop/learning session if the subject area is one we have prepared/is easily prepared.

Generally discussing pretty much any aspect of working as a musician – fees, self-employment, touring, recording, self-release etc.

This would be provided free of charge with the MU covering all costs related to travel and subsistence. MU literature will be available during the course of the event. In relation to an 'in kind' valuation this would be around £600.

In addition they can potentially provide an MU themed panel where they organise and bring in panellists. They would often pay a fee as well as covering costs negotiated in respect of 'reach' (as they have to weigh up the benefits in terms of promoting membership) and additional benefits such as adverts etc.

**THREE MINUTE HEROES** - Following our successful TMH Music and Mental Health project we would be keen to run a panel around this subject bringing some interesting speakers and guests who resonate with the topic. We have had discussions with Help Musicians and have links with artists who are open about how its effected them. We can also discuss the topics of education and being creative in the classroom at a young age.
