A PHILIP LARKIN TIMELINE

1884: 25 April Sydney Larkin born (Lichfield, Staffordshire)

1886: 10 January Eva Emily Day born (Littleborough, Lancashire)

1906: 6 August Eva and Sydney meet for the first time (Rhyl, North Wales)

1911: 5 October Eva and Sydney marry Leigh, (Lancashire)

1912: 21 August Catherine Emily Larkin (Kitty) born (Birmingham)

1922: Born - 9 August (Wednesday) 2 Poultney Road, Radford, Coventry, England

14 September: baptised Philip Arthur Larkin at the Cathedral of St. Michael Coventry

1930: September: enters **King Henry VIII School** (Preparatory Department) **Coventry**, where he meets **Jim Sutton** for the first time

1932: September: moves up to King Henry VIII Senior School

1939: April: 'Summer Nocturne' Larkin's first published poem appears in the King Henry VIII School magazine The Coventrian

1940: 9 October: enters St. John's College Oxford to read English Language and Literature

November: 'Ultimatum' published in *The Listener* (Vol. XXIV. No.620); Larkin's first poem published in a national weekly

1943: 4 July: graduates with a Bachelor of Arts (English, First Class) from Oxford University

16 November: appointed Librarian at Wellington, Shropshire where he meets Ruth Bowman for the first time

1945: July: The North Ship, Larkin's first collection of poems, published by R.A. Caton of the Fortune Press (London)

1946: June: offered post of Assistant Librarian at University College Leicester where he meets **Monica Jones** for the first time (1947)

October: Jill, Larkin's first novel in print, published by the Fortune Press (London)

1947: 21 February: A Girl in Winter published by the Fortune Press (London)

1948: 26 March: Sydney Larkin dies, aged 63

17 May: becomes engaged to Ruth Bowman

1950: 17 June: proposes marriage to Ruth Bowman (withdraws the proposal two weeks later on 2 July)

2 October: first day as Sub-Librarian at **Queen's University Belfast** where he meets **Winifred Arnott** and **Patsy Strang** for the first time

1951: 27 April: XX Poems privately printed for Larkin in an edition of 100 copies by Carswells of Belfast

1954: March: The Fantasy Poets, Philip Larkin, No. 21 published by the Fantasy Press, Swynford, Eynsham (Oxford)

1955: 21 March: first day as Librarian at University of Hull where he meets Maeve Brennan for the first time

November: The Less Deceived published by George and Jean Hartley of the Marvell Press (Hessle)

1956: 13 July: **John Shakespeare** article 'Four young poets - 1. Philip Larkin' (heavily re-drafted by Larkin himself) appears anonymously in the *Times Educational Supplement*

1957: 20 May: Betty Mackereth becomes Larkin's secretary

1961: 6 March: collapses during a Library Committee meeting, but tests at **Hull** Kingston General hospital are inconclusive

10 April: admitted to the London Hospital, Whitechapel under the care of neurologist Sir Russell Brain

1964: 28 February: The Whitsun Weddings published by Faber and Faber (London)

15 December: *Down Cemetery Road*, the BBC TV Monitor documentary directed by Patrick Garland, broadcast for the first time

1965: 26 April: awarded Queen's Gold Medal for Poetry

1970: 9 February: All What Jazz is published by Faber and Faber (London)

June: 'The Explosion' as a single-leaf broadsheet published by The Poem-of-the-Month Club Ltd. (London)

1973: 29 March: The Oxford Book of Twentieth Century English Verse chosen by Philip Larkin, published by Clarendon Press (Oxford)

1974: 3 June: High Windows published by Faber and Faber (London)

27 June: moves out of 32 Pearson Park and in to 105 Newland Park

1975: 8 May: receives notice that he is to be awarded the CBE; the investiture takes place at Buckingham Palace in November 1975

1976: 17 July: guests on Desert Island Discs (BBC Radio Four)

1977: 17 November: Eva Larkin dies, aged 91

29 November: completes 'Aubade' - published in the Times Literary Supplement 23 December 1977

1983: 10 April: returns with **Monica Jones** (suffering with shingles) from her cottage in **Haydon Bridge**. After a short stay in hospital, she moves in with him permanently

21 November: Required Writing: Miscellaneous Pieces 1955-1982 published by Faber and Faber (London)

1985: Dies - 2 December (1.24 a.m. Monday) **Philip Larkin** was 63 at the time of his death from cancer — the same age (as Larkin had predicted) at which his father died

9 December: Larkin's funeral service takes place at St Mary the Virgin, Cottingham

1986: 1 February: Larkin's memorial service takes place at Westminster Abbey

1988: 10 October Philip Larkin: Collected Poems - edited by Anthony Thwaite (Faber and Faber)

1992: 19 October Selected Letters of Philip Larkin 1940-1985 - edited by Anthony Thwaite (Faber and Faber)

1993: 10 October Philip Larkin: A Writer's Life Andrew Motion (Faber and Faber)

2001: 15 February Monica Jones dies (aged 78)

1 November Philip Larkin: Further Requirements - edited by Anthony Thwaite (Faber and Faber)

- 2003: 11 June Maeve Brennan dies (aged 73)
- 2010: 2 December Philip Larkin Statue unveiled at Hull Paragon created by Martin Jennings
- 2011: 18 July Jean Hartley dies (aged 78)
