Will you be allowing for promotion costs and what is the reach of your social media presence? How many are in the supporters trust?

I'd like to see a workshop or 2 for children on a weekend or school holiday. The education room is next to the Open Space and is available for £55 a day. I will try and get our established Time Troopers event to hold a session during the exhibition, there wouldn't be room hire charges for this but if you had some input into activity resources that would be good.

Would need to see more details on how the supporters flag would be secured.

We can say yes in principle to allow you to apply for Creative Communities Programme funding. Would you be bringing an arts theme into your project? This is one of their key requirements. Again not a problem in principle if you wanted to use our education space for a workshop , subject to prior bookings.
