TURNER // **RETURN** is a special late night event on Thursday 16 November and will see the gallery transformed with live music, dance, film screenings, as well as workshops, tours and talks by artists, curators and writers.

With Turner Prize 2017 already attracting big audiences, it is hoped the event will encourage new and younger visitors to the Ferens Art Gallery or invite people back to the gallery to view the works in a different light.

All 4 speakers will wear lapel microphones and 1 volunteer will have a handheld microphone for the Q&A. RETURN // DEBATE 18:00 - 22:00	Fandangoekid (artist Annie Nicholson) is a graphic artist who documents love and loss and encourages a more open approach to typically taboo subjects. She has created a large-scale mural to be displayed in the gallery café. Fandangoekid will also lead a drop-in creative workshop offering an open platform for dialogue and discussion. The workshop is capped at 10 people at any one time. The workshop will involve using PVA glue to paste paper slogans onto large boards. 2 x trestle tables will be covered with plastic sheeting to prevent damage to café furniture. The café will stop serving food at 17:00 and serve only drinks until 22:00. Drinks can be circulated everywhere excluding Gallery 4. Volunteers will be stationed on the doors of G4 to prevent guests taking drinks into the space. Their workshop, titled <i>Meet Me at the Blue Box</i> is a place to meet and share ideas.
