2097: We Made Ourselves Over is a jointly commissioned project for Hull UK City of Culture 2017 and Aarhus 2017 European Capital of Culture.

The project asks the people of Hull and Aarhus to imagine their cities 80 years from now — the kind of communities they want to live in, how they think challenges such as climate change might impact on them, and the spaces and places they want to see there.

Blast Theory kicked off this year-long project last Autumn. They began by interviewing 'future experts' — specialists in the study of climate change, technology, community and economics - to explore the possible opportunities and challenges the future might hold for each city.

Then using these conversations as inspiration — which are being released via a monthly blog at www.wemadeourselvesover.com - in December 2016 young people from the city took part in workshops with young people from Aarhus, in which they were challenged to invent a new skyline for the city; re-imagine everyday life and propose new forms of living.

A series of free live events will unite all of the strands of this wide-reaching arts project, the details of which will be announced in the Summer

Stace casting call (Denmark)

In order to reflect the diversity of the population in Aarhus and Hull that was not yet apparent in the cast, in the casting brief for Stace we stated that we were looking to cast an 'Actor from Black, Asian Minority Ethnic background'.

Casting brief copy:

'This July we're shooting five sci-fi short films in Aarhus and Hull (UK). The films are set in the year 2097, taking place in the hybrid city of Aarhull and we're looking to cast the role of a young girl called Stace in Denmark.

2097: We Made Ourselves Over is a science fiction event which engages its audience in a story which is citywide. Diverse communities across Hull (UK) and Aarhus will work in partnership with the artists to develop a speculative future for the city employing writing, mobile gaming and film.

The work will consist of an app for smartphones, intimate face to face encounters with players across the city, two live experiences in Hull (UK City of Culture 2017) and Aarhus (European Capital of Culture 2017) and a series of extraordinary films, We Made Ourselves Over invites audiences to come together to play, to explore and to dream of new futures.

The project is a co-commission between Aarhus 2017 European Capital of Culture and Hull UK City of Culture 2017 and the final films will be screened online, in a mobile app, live in Aarhus and Hull this Autumn and we will also be submitting them to film festivals.

Character outline: Stace

Stace is a 13 year old girl. She appears in one scene where she is chosen to become a leader of a new city, along with her two friends. This will be approximately $^{1}/_{2}$ a day of filming in central Aarhus. This is a non-speaking part however the crew and Director are English-speaking.

What we're looking for:

- Amateur-level actor
- Female
- Playing age of 13-years-old
- Actor from Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic background

Filming details:

- One scene
- One $\frac{1}{2}$ day shooting between $16^{th} 18^{th}$ July (exact date and time TBC)
- Non-speaking role but the crew will be English-speaking
- This is a paid role and travel and accommodation is covered

Aarhus 2017 shared the brief on their social channels. The brief was also sent to local Aarhus acting schools.

Celebrant casting

For the role of the Celebrant we are making a direct approach to Black, Asian Minority Ethnic backgrounds to again reflect the diversity across the two cities.

Responses

We received 61 applicants to the Hull call out.

We received 15 applicants to the Aarhus call out.

Auditions

Hull auditions

Everyone who fit the casting brief was invited to an initial audition that took place on May 18 organised by Bridge Way Films. 51 people were auditioned in total. These were recorded and sent to the Director who then picked who to take forward to the second auditions.

Bridge Way Films also ran the second auditions and the Director attended. 33 people were auditioned and the three were finally chosen to fill the roles.

Aarhus auditions

Blast Theory hired a Danish Casting Director to organise and help promote the Danish auditions. One audition day was held on 24th May in Aarhus and another was held on 26th May in Copenhagen. 11 people were auditioned in total. 4 people who applied could not make the audition day.
