A creative collective of multimedia specialists in delivering innovative performance opportunities and creative projects for both artistic and commercial output.



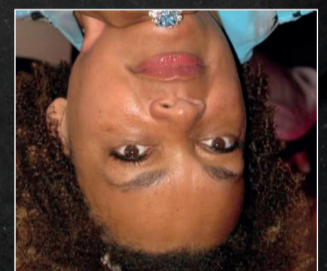
URBAN PROJECTIONS

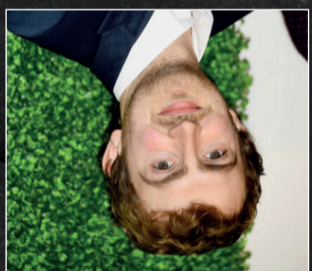
ZSOLT BALOGH
