Mysterious Gold Nose of Green Ginger returning to Bransholme

One of city's most elusive treasures to go on display

ONE of Hull's most elusive treasures, the Gold Nose of Green Ginger, will be temporarily returned to Bransholme this summer.

Described as "looking like a ginger root... roughly in the shape of a warty nose," the nose was considered nothing more than an urban myth until it was discovered 67 years ago during excavations to lay the foundations for the first houses on the estate.

Legend claims that those who came into contact with it were blessed with unexpected and plentiful good luck.

Many thought the nose was lost, but the artefact was uncovered during the Green Ginger Fellowship's investigations into a number of crates found underneath the city in February.

The Fellowship were drawn to a crate that smelled strongly of ginger and the legendary Gold Nose turned out to be nestled in that particular crate.

North Point Shopping Centre manager Louise Smith said: "We're deeply honoured to be hosting the Gold Nose of Green Ginger here at North Point. We're in close contact with the Green Ginger Fellowship - they're using one of our empty shop units to temporarily showcase the Gold Nose."

"They also found a lot of old shop fittings when they discovered it, so they're going to see how they can use them in the unit. I've no idea how it's going to look, but we're just leaving them to it."

"This has been part of the mythology of the area for hundreds of years, so we never dreamed we'd ever actually come into close contact with it. It's incredibly inspiring."

"We're particularly looking forward to seeing if the stories of good luck are true!"



After the discovery of the Nose, the Green Ginger Fellowship's investigations took another unexpected turn over the weekend when one of the crates that mysteriously appeared during the Back To Ours festival at North Point revealed a large number of nose casts.

Allison Deaves, co-founder of the Green Ginger Fellowship, said: "We were perplexed enough at the appearance of a number of smaller crates at North Point, but we certainly didn't expect one to contain the noses of Bransholme."

"It's not your everyday find, but then we're getting used to expecting the unexpected in this investigation!"

"There's been a lot of activity around North Point recently, and people are asking if this could be the next Act of Wanton Wonder - our priority at this point is making sure the Gold Nose is returned back to Bransholme, where it belongs."

The Gold Nose of Green Ginger will be on display from Sunday, June 18, to Saturday, August 19. During this time, people will be able to see it at close quarters and partake in a range of activities and workshops.
